RECORDKEEPING REQUIREMENTS FOR MINORS

State Laws may not specifically require employers to keep data specifically on minors, although general recordkeeping requirements on the federal level may call for maintenance of that data.

Other Requirements

Post statutory sections. Keep records for at least 1 year. Employers of persons exempted from child labor laws should keep on file proof of employee's exempt status.

Work Permit or Age Certificate Required

Yes. Work permits not necessary for minors 13 or older not regularly enrolled in school. Youth Employment Standards Act does not prohibit employment of minors over age 15 who have completed requirements for high school graduation or equivalency certificate.
