Hand Tools



Storage of Tools & Maintenance

Provide suitable cabinet for storage of tools & identify them.

Maintain hand tools in good working condition. Inspect the regularly for defect.



Power Operated Tool


Select & use tools operating at 110V where possible. Make employees aware of the hazard & manufacturers operating instructions.

Where a specific tool is not available at 110V then 240V must be used only with 30mA RCD.



Select the right Tools

Supervisors have a responsibility to ensure correct tools are available. Do not modify tools in any way



Use the Tool Correctly Use of PPE

Use appropriate PPE as detailed in manufacturers instructions. Manager must provide training in the use of tools where necessary.



Quality of Tool Unsafe Tool

Ensure that good quality tools are selected, procured & issued to labourers. Register to be maintained for issuance of PPE.



Cartridge Operated Tools

No person shall use cartridge operated tools unless he has been trained & is experienced in the operation.

Shall be fitted with guards if there is potential hazard of flying pins & splinters.
