Through implementing a behavior or value-based safety approach, these companies have eliminated the barriers that prevented them from achieving an integrated safety accountability system in which employees take ownership of their daily activities. Each of these companies will usually see additional payoffs in terms of quality and production, which often accompany low and stable incidence rates.
